

After Hospitalization: Dartmouth Atlas Report on Post-Acute Care

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
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Measurement Parameters

- 100% of fee-for-service Medicare beneficiaries in the 306
 Dartmouth Atlas hospital referral regions
- Hospital claims from short-term acute or critical access hospitals in 306 hospital referral regions (HRR)
- Examined six Medicare patient populations:
 - Medical conditions
 - Surgical conditions
 - hip fracture
 - Congestive heart failure
 - Acute myocardial infarction
 - Pneumonia
- Examined 94 academic medical centers across the nation




Medicare patients readmitted within 30 days of discharge

- CHF Readmissions




Medicare patients seeing a primary care clinician within 14 days of discharge to home






Patients having an emergency room visit within 30 days of discharge





Medical patients having an ambulatory visit within 14 days of discharge to home






Hospital Referral Regions

- A Hospital Referral Region (HRR) is defined by documenting where Medicare patients are referred for major cardiovascular surgical procedures and for neurosurgery
- Oregon has 5 hospital referral regions (Portland, Salem, Eugene, Medford, Bend)
- Each region has several hospitals that receive referred patients
- The Portland and Medford regions receive referrals from outside Oregon




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Oregon Medicare patients having an emergency room visit within 30 days of discharge

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
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Oregon Hospital Referral Regions

Conclusions

- Little progress has been made in the U.S. between 2004 and 2009
- Oregon readmission rates are lower than national rates:
 - 1.7 % (11% relative) lower for medical admissions
 - 3.0% (24% relative) lower for surgical admissions
- 46.7% of medical patients in Oregon visited a primary care clinician within 14 days of hospital discharge
- 63.8 % had one or more ambulatory visits
- Readmission rates and ambulatory follow-up visits are only indirect measures of the effectiveness of care coordination
- Variability exists between Oregon HRRs
 - Salem, OR led the nation for 30 day ED use following medical discharge
- Oregon's opportunity for improvement is unknown
