WHERE WE HAVE BEEN

- Hospitals doing their own thing around readmission data
- Variable processes and software
- No method to track patients being admitted to another Oregon hospital





WHERE WE ARE GOING

- Standardized approach for all Oregon hospitals
- Apprise Health Insights
 - OAHHS Data subsidiary
 - Data is from quarterly claims data (CompData) that all hospitals provide now
 - Uses 3M software for analysis

Apprise Readmissions Report

- Tracks Potentially Preventable Readmissions (PPR) regardless of where the readmission occurred
- From high-level to case-level
 - Reports range from service line, to DRG, to individual claims
- Menu-driven and Excel-based
- Focuses on highest-risk areas

Why track readmissions?

Readmissions cost money.

- Hospitals face CMS payment penalties up to 3%
- Readmissions reflect unwanted patient outcomes.
- High readmissions boost media and public scrutiny.



Examining Potentially Preventable Readmission (PPR) Rates

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WHAT IS A PPR? POTENTIALLY PREVENTABLE READMISSION

It's a readmission.

 A return to hospitalization that follows a prior admission

It's clinically-related.

 Plausibly related to the care rendered during prior hospital admission

It's within 7 or 30 days of discharge.

The Apprise reports focus on these 2 time periods






